REQUEST FOR ACCESS UNDER THE FREEDOM OF INFORMATION ACT 1982

I refer to your email dated 6 May 2023 seeking access to documents under the *Freedom of Information Act 1982* (the Act). Your request was for:

I am writing to make a request under the Freedom of Information Act for a complete copy of the departments' Freedom of Information (FOI) logs for the period 2013-2023, including any secondary departments controlled by the agency.

I request that this is provided as a document and not a simple redirect to the agency website as I am of the view that your online disclosure logs do not actively reflect your FOI requests that you have received in this period.

The date range of your access request is 1 January 2013 to 6 May 2023.

On 23 May 2023, you received a preliminary charges notice, which is valid for a 30-day period under section 29(1)(f) of the Act. During this period, you must either agree to pay the charge, contend that the charge has been wrongly assessed, or withdraw the request for access to the document concerned. If you do not advise on one of these three actions, your request is taken to be withdrawn under section 29(1)(q).

No further communications had been received from you in this regard.

Decision

As CASA has not received from you any further correspondence regarding the preliminary charges notice, in accordance with section 29(1)(f) of the FOI Act, the request received on 6 May 2023 is now taken to be withdrawn.

Application for internal review of decision

Section 54 of the Act gives you the right to apply for an internal review of my decision. An application for internal review of my decision must be made in writing within 30 days of receipt of this letter.
