As background, when the first iteration of the referendym ballot paper was produced by our team last year, it was a request from Michael Lynch, via Section 47F I queried at the time whether there was scope to look at the design of the ballot paper and was instructed to base it on our latest referendum ballot paper (I believe that would have been the 2013 version). The only modification made was to remove the italics on "YES" and "NO".

As this version (or the sample ballot paper, based on this version) has already been printed in the

Yes/No pamphlet and many other polling place products, my recommendation would be to maintain consistency with those products and not make any alterations. We can certainly look at reviewing the design for the next referendum, but for this event, I think the time for changes has well and truly passed.

The design of this ballot paper follows established conventions, in line with our other ballot paper products, providing consistency to the voter. Re the bolding, the visual contrast between the bold and Roman text aids with comprehension and helps establish the information hierarchy. Having the question in Roman (and different to the surrounding text) helps you focus in on this piece of text.

Re the state/territory information - while critical to the count - is less important to the voter than the other information on the page.

4．For the text under the box replace layout A below（current layout）with layout B （and again use single－quotation marks instead of double）－ this alternative layout would reduce the risk that the BP design will be seen as advantaging the＇Yes＇case．
