- We have received approximately <u>500 emails</u> on the "ticks and crosses" issue. Almost all have been actioned. There are about 9 unread (as at 4pm) and another 40 (approx.) to be followed up.
- It is difficult to estimate the number of phone calls we actioned due to system limitations, but anecdotally we would estimate it was around <u>200 calls</u> on this issue.
- We have been responding using standard wording developed by media and as present in ECCA.
- A large number of clients have asked for the ballot paper's design to be changed. We have advised that the design of the ballot paper is set out in the R(MP)A and that this would require legislative change.
