#### NOTICE OF DECISION

I refer to your request of 10 June 2015 to the Department of Health (Department) seeking access under the *Freedom of Information Act 1982* (FOI Act) to:

"the 2014 budget summary spent in particular on pregnant women in the Indigenous communities in Australia as well as any supporting documentation showing correspondence between the Department of Health and specific hospitals in rural areas or Indigenous communities to take action/implement programs to reduce the incidence of Indigenous death rates during childbirth."

I am writing to advise you of my decision.

#### Decision

I am satisfied that all reasonable steps have been taken to find the documents referred to in your request including a thorough and extensive search and consultation with the relevant policy and program areas. The Department has been unable to find any such documents.

I am satisfied that the documents referred to in your request do not exist, and as a consequence, I refuse access to the document referred to in your request pursuant to section 24A of the FOI Act.

I have however, provided the following link to the Media Release document from Senator the Hon Fiona Nash, Assistant Minister for Health, which is publicly available and outlines the Australian Government investment in Indigenous maternal and child health. This investment includes the provision of \$94 million to the *Better Start to Life approach* to expand support for Indigenous children to be healthy and go to school.

## Review rights
