As flagged in David's email below, yesterday we wrote to the High Court (on behalf of both parties) requesting that the matter be listed for an urgent directions hearing to inform the Court of recent factual developments on the Department's efforts to remove NZYQ from Australia, and to enable the parties to make submissions on whether the hearing listed for 7-8 November 2023 should be vacated in light of these developments.

The High Court has now listed the case for directions via audio- video connection this **Friday 20 October, at 2pm**. The Court has directed the parties to file submissions by **4:00pm on Thursday, 19 October**, advising on the implications of this development for the hearing scheduled on 7 and 8 November 2023.
