Your application under the Government Information (Public Access) Act 2009 (GIPA Act)

On **25 February 2016** we received your application for the following information under the GIPA Act:

I am inquiring about the Dial a Dump site at Albert St, St Peters. This is now known locally as the Alexandria Landfill Site and as far as I am aware is known as that to RMS. WestConnex Delivery Authority took it over in December 2014 but it was later transferred to RMS and is currently in its possession. I want all documents and records including information about or relating to any storm damage on site after a storm even in April 2015. Even if any such records were originally WDA records they would be included in RMS records for the site.

Transport for NSW (TfNSW) receives and acknowledges applications under the GIPA Act before sending them to the relevant transport agency to make a decision. Your application will be processed by Roads and Maritime Services.

When will we decide your application?

Under the GIPA Act, your application must be decided within 20 working days being **24 March 2016**.

Please note that if we are required by the GIPA Act to retrieve records from archives and/or consult with any third party we can extend the decision date.

If your application has not been decided by the decision date, your application is considered to have been refused (a deemed refusal). Should this occur, we will continue to make a (late) decision and refund your application fee. You may apply for a review of the deemed refusal decision.

In some circumstances, the agency may decide that some information about your application may be of interest to other members of the public and decide to include details of the application in its disclosure log. Should this occur, the agency would ask if you object to details of your application being included in the disclosure log when notifying notify you of the outcome of your application. The decision of an agency to include details in its disclosure log is a reviewable decision.

What are your review rights?
