FREEDOM OF INFORMATION ("FOI") REQUEST – NOTICE OF DECISION UNDER SECTION 26 OF THE FREEDOM OF INFORMATION ACT1982 ("FOI ACT")

I refer to your email correspondence dated 17 July 2016 in which you made a request for access to information pursuant to the *Freedom of Information Act 1982* (Cth) ("the Act").

Specifically, you requested the following:

"Following the provision of a large number of documents from IOOF by a whistleblower to ASIC, ASIC commenced an investigation into IOOF where allegations of insider trading and "front running" where made.

This investigation was reported in Fairfax Media.

The documents I seek are copies of any correspondence between ASIC and the Office of the CDPP in relation to the IOOF investigation and specifically related to whether there was sufficient evidence to hand for the Office of the CDPP to commence legal proceedings against any current or former employees or directors of IOOF or subsidiary companies.

The names and any personal details of any persons mentioned in such correspondence can be redacted."

DECISION AND REASONS FOR DECISION

After conducting a comprehensive search of all CDPP records I have been unable to locate any documents relating to your request.

Accordingly, pursuant to section 24A (1) of the FOI Act, I am refusing your request for access for documents on the basis that the documents you requested do not exist,

RIGHTS OF REVIEW

Under section 26 of the FOI Act I am required to inform you of your rights of review.

Section 54 of the FOI Act gives you the right to apply for an internal review of the decision refusing to grant access to documents. There is no application fee however the application for internal review of the decision must be made in writing within 30 days of receipt of this letter. No particular form is required but it is desirable to set out in the application the grounds on which you consider that the decision should be reviewed. If the decision on internal review goes against you, you are entitled to seek a review of that decision by the Information Commissioner.

Alternatively, you are entitled to bypass the internal review process and make an application directly with the Office of the Information Commissioner pursuant to section 54L of the FOI Act.
