RE: YOUR FREEDOM OF INFORMATION REQUEST

I refer to your email of 9 August 2016 (<u>Attachment A</u>) in which you sought access to the following information under the *Freedom of Information Act 1982* (FOI Act):

'...any meeting minutes from the previous twelve months created by the The Cross Portfolio Data Integration Oversight Board and held by the Australian Bureau of Statistics.'

Response to your request

I am an authorised decision maker under section 23 of the FOI Act.

A search has been conducted for documents relevant to your request. As the Cross Portfolio Data Integration Oversight Board has not met in the past 12 months no documents have been found that would fall within the terms of your request. Therefore in accordance with subsection 24A(1)(b)(ii) of the FOI Act (see Attachment B), I refuse your request on the grounds that no documents exist.

Please note that in line with Prime Minister and Cabinet report, *Public Sector Data Management*, released in July 2015, the governance of data policies has been streamlined. The Secretaries Data Group (SDG) now has responsibility for data integration policy. The Department of Prime Minister and Cabinet provides secretariat support for the SDG.

The ABS will not charge you any fees associated with processing this FOI request.

Internal Review of the Decision

Section 54 of the FOI Act gives you the right to apply for an internal review of the decision by the Australian Bureau of Statistics. Freedom of Information Act 1982

Section 24A

24A Requests may be refused if documents cannot be found, do not exist or have not been received

Document lost or non-existent

- An agency or Minister may refuse a request for access to a document if:
 - (a) all reasonable steps have been taken to find the document;
 and
 - (b) the agency or Minister is satisfied that the document:
 - (i) is in the agency's or Minister's possession but cannot be found; or
 - (ii) does not exist.

Document not received as required by contract

- (2) An agency may refuse a request for access to a document if:
 - (a) in order to comply with section 6C, the agency has taken contractual measures to ensure that it receives the document;
 - (b) the agency has not received the document; and
 - (c) the agency has taken all reasonable steps to receive the document in accordance with those contractual measures.

INFORMATION ON RIGHTS OF REVIEW

1. APPLICATION FOR INTERNAL REVIEW OF DECISION

If you disagree with our decision you have the right to apply for an internal review under section 54 of the FOI Act.

Application for a review of the decision must be made within 30 days of receipt of this letter.

No particular form is required but it would assist the decision-maker were you to set out in the application the grounds on which you consider that the decision should be reviewed.

2. APPLICATION TO AUSTRALIAN INFORMATION COMMISSIONER (INFORMATION COMMISSIONER) FOR REVIEW OF DECISION

Section 54L of the Act gives you the right to seek a review of the decision from the Information Commissioner. An application for review must be made within 60 days of receiving the decision.

Applications for review must be in writing and must:

- · give details of how notices must be sent to you; and
- · include a copy of the notice of decision.

3. COMPLAINTS TO THE INFORMATION COMMISSIONER

Section 70 of the Act provides that a person may complain to the Information Commissioner about action taken by an agency in the exercise of powers or the performance of functions under the Act.

A complaint to the Information Commissioner must be in writing and identify the agency the complaint is about. It should be directed to the following address:

The Information Commissioner may decline to investigate the complaint in a number of circumstances, including that you did not exercise your right to ask the agency, the Information Commissioner, a court or tribunal to review the decision.
