Freedom of Information Request ACIC 16-18

I refer to your request for access under the Freedom of Information Act 1982 (the FOI Act) to:

A copy of a Deed of Variation dated 20 November 1974 that amends the provisions of an occupational pension scheme established by a Trust Deed dated 23 December 1913 to add Regulation 30A and where the original sponsoring employer was a company called Elder Smith & Co Ltd.

Your request was received by the ACIC on Saturday 13 August 2016. An acknowledgment letter was sent to you on 15 August informing you that a decision was due to be made in relation to this request by **Monday 12 September 2016**.

This is a decision made under the FOI Act in relation to a document within the scope of that request.
