Freedom of Information Request – Compulsory Third Party Insurance Scheme

I am writing to acknowledge receipt of your request submitted under section 14 of the *ACT Freedom of Information Act 1989*, addressed to Access Canberra and received by the Chief Minister, Treasury and Economic Development Directorate (CMTEDD) on 26 September 2016.

In your request you are specifically seeking the following (in relation to “*the Compulsory Third Party scheme for vehicle insurance in the ACT*”):

- *The number of successful claims over the past ten years.*
- *The number of successful claims made where the at-fault party was a motorcycle rider.*
- *The average cost of a successful claim.*
- *The average cost of a successful claim where the at-fault party was a motorcycle rider*
- *The ongoing annual liability for existing claims.*
- *The ongoing annual liability for existing claims where the at-fault party was a motorcycle rider.*
- *The total annual liability for CTP claims.*
- *The total annual liability for CTP claims where the at fault party was a motorcycle rider.”*

CMTEDD is required to provide you with a decision on access to documents within the terms of the request within 30 days after the date the request was received, unless an extension of time has been negotiated with you. The due date for a decision on your request is **26 October 2016**.
