## RE: Application for documents under the Commonwealth Freedom of Information Act 1982

I refer to your Freedom of Information request received on 3 October 2016 in which you seek access to documents under the Freedom of Information Act 1982 ("FOI Act"). You have requested the following from Australia Post:

"...the latest document...that describes or reviews [Australia Post's] policy for tracking, monitoring or intercepting mail to specific groups or individuals]....."

I am informed by Australia Post's General Manager, Corporate Security Group that Australia Post does not have any documents pertaining to your request. Australia Post does not track or monitor for the purpose of intercepting mail to specific groups or individuals but will allow Commonwealth and State law enforcement agencies to undertake these activities upon application. Accordingly if such documents exist, they would be held by those external agencies.

## Decision

Having taken all reasonable steps to find documents relating to your request, I am satisfied that no such document exists. Accordingly pursuant to s.24A of the Freedom of Information Act 1982 your request for documents is refused.

## **Rights of Review**

If you are unhappy with this decision you have the right to seek either;
