Authorised decision-maker

As noted in my previous letter to you, I am authorised by the Minister to make decisions on his behalf in relation to requests made under the FOI Act.

Searches

After your response to the Practical Refusal Consultation Notice I issued, you indicated to me your unwillingness to revise the request.

After that, I initiated a process of further searches regarding the request.

As a result of these searches I have identified no documents within the scope of your request.

Decision and reasons for decision

Under section 24A (1) of the FOI Act, a Minister may refuse a request for access to documents if all reasonable steps have been taken to find the documents and the Minister is satisfied that the document is either:

- in the Minister's possession but cannot be found; or
- does not exist.

As the decision maker, all reasonable steps have been taken to identify documents relevant to the applicant's request and that no documents relevant to the request are in possessed. I have therefore decided to refuse the request under subparagraph 24A(1)(b)(ii) of the FOI Act.

I have enclosed information about your rights of review under the FOI Act at Attachment A.

External Review by the Australian Information Commissioner

Section 54L of the FOI Act gives you the right to apply directly to the Australian Information Commissioner (AIC) to seek a review of this decision.
