The worst offences can vary depending the type of non-compliances and/or the number of non-compliances within a food business. Examples of such offences can include pest control problems, unclean food premises and incorrect food storage methods etc.</p> <p>Council can issue a Penalty infringement notice of up to \$880 for each breach of the Food</p>		

Standards Code.
