RE: YOUR FREEDOM OF INFORMATION REQUEST

I refer to your email of 24 January 2017 in which you sought access to the following information under the *Freedom of Information Act 1982* (FOI Act) (**Attachment A**):

"Could I please request statistics surrounding the number of offences committed by offenders already on bail, Australia and Qld wide, dating from year 2000 to most current?"

Response to your request

I am an authorised decision maker under section 23 of the FOI Act.

Statistical information collected by the Australian Bureau of Statistics (ABS) is obtained under the authority of the *Census and Statistics Act 1905*. Under Schedule 2, Part II, Division 2 of the FOI Act, this information cannot be released through a FOI request. As such, no access will be granted.

Regarding the information you seek, I recommend that you contact the ABS' National Information Referral Service (NIRS) on 1300 135 070. NIRS consultants will be able to determine if the ABS collects the information you require and, if the information is collected by the ABS, can advise you on how to access the information. In those cases where the ABS does not collect the data, NIRS consultants may be able to suggest other agencies or departments that you might like to contact.

Internal Review of the Decision

Section 54 of the FOI Act gives you the right to apply for an internal review of the decision by the ABS. Additionally you may request a review of this decision by the Information Commissioner. Details of both procedures involved in an application to review a decision are set out at **Attachment B**.

INFORMATION ON RIGHTS OF REVIEW

1. APPLICATION FOR INTERNAL REVIEW OF DECISION

If you disagree with our decision you have the right to apply for an internal review under section 54 of the FOI Act.

Application for a review of the decision must be made within 30 days of receipt of this letter.

No particular form is required but it would assist the decision-maker were you to set out in the application the grounds on which you consider that the decision should be reviewed.

2. APPLICATION TO AUSTRALIAN INFORMATION COMMISSIONER (INFORMATION COMMISSIONER) FOR REVIEW OF DECISION

Section 54L of the Act gives you the right to seek a review of the decision from the Information Commissioner. An application for review must be made within 60 days of receiving the decision.

Applications for review must be in writing and must:

- give details of how notices must be sent to you; and
- include a copy of the notice of decision.

3. COMPLAINTS TO THE INFORMATION COMMISSIONER

Section 70 of the Act provides that a person may complain to the Information Commissioner about action taken by an agency in the exercise of powers or the performance of functions under the Act.

A complaint to the Information Commissioner must be in writing and identify the agency the complaint is about. It should be directed to the following address:

The Information Commissioner may decline to investigate the complaint in a number of circumstances, including that you did not exercise your right to ask the agency, the Information Commissioner, a court or tribunal to review the decision.
