Summary

1. I have made a decision to release the documents subject to your request in full.

I am an officer authorised by the Secretary of the Department of Infrastructure and Regional
Development (the Department) to make decisions about access to documents in the possession of
the Department in accordance with section 23(1) of the Freedom of Information Act 1982 (the FOI
Act).

Background

3. On 28 March 2017 you made a request for access to documents in the possession of the Department. Your request sought access to:

Documents subject to this request

4. The Department has undertaken a search of its records and has identified one document that falls within the scope of your request. The document is listed in the schedule of documents at schedule 1.

Decision

5. I have made a decision to release the document subject to your request in full.

Your rights of review

5. If you disagree with your FOI decision, you can ask for the decision to be reviewed. There are two ways you can ask for review of a decision: internal review by the Department, and external review by the Office of the Australian Information Commissioner (OAIC).

Internal Review

7. You can ask the Department to review its decision in relation to access to documents. There is no charge for internal review. You must apply within 30 days of being notified of the decision, unless the Department extends the application time. You should contact the Department if you wish to seek an extension. The Department must make a review decision within 30 days. If it does not do so, its original decision is considered to be affirmed. The review will be carried out by a different departmental officer, usually someone at a more senior level. You must apply in writing and you can lodge your application in one of the following ways:

Information Commissioner Review

- 8. The OAIC is an independent office that can review the decisions of agencies and ministers under the FOI Act and investigates complaints about agency actions.
- 9. You can ask the OAIC to review the Department's decision. You do not need to seek an internal review from the Department before seeking a review from the OAIC. However, going through the Department's internal review process gives us the opportunity to reconsider the initial decision and your needs may be met more quickly without undergoing an external review process.
- 10. The OAIC's review is free. You must apply to the OAIC within 60 days of being given notice of the decision. You can ask the OAIC for an extension of time to apply, and this may be granted if it considers it is reasonable in the circumstances.
