Freedom of Information Request: No. 063-1314

The Department of Health and Ageing (the Department) has received your email dated 17 September 2013, in which you made a request under the *Freedom of Information Act 1982* (the Act), seeking access to:

- '... any briefs, meeting notes, correspondence, determinations and other such documents which relate to:
- (a) The decision(s) to place the substance 'Piracetam' on Schedule 4 of the Poisons Standard; and
- (b) The safety of Piracetam administration in humans'

Timeframe for receiving your decision

The statutory timeframe for processing your request is 30 calendar days from the day after your valid request was received. The Department is currently scheduled to provide you with a decision by 17 October 2013. The date may be extended where:

- charges are levied as prescribed by the Freedom of Information (Fees and Charges)
 Regulations; and/or
- consultation with third parties is necessary.

Charges

Agencies may decide that an applicant is liable to pay a charge in respect of a request for access to documents. If the Department decides to charge you in respect of this FOI request, we will send you a preliminary assessment of the charges as soon as possible.

Consultation with third parties

The Department may be required under the Act to consult other parties (third parties) where information relating to third parties arises in documents sought by you. The Act prescribes a further 30 calendar days processing time for the Department to undertake this consultation. You will be advised of any requirement to consult with a third party.

Publication

In accordance with Government policy agencies are required to publish information which has been released under FOI on a disclosure log. The disclosure log requirement does not apply to personal information about a person or information about a business or the commercial, financial or professional affairs of any person where it is considered unreasonable to publish.
