Request under the *Freedom of Information Act 1982* (Cth)

I refer to your correspondence of 2 November 2017 to the office of Senator the Hon Michaelia Cash, Minister for Employment, via the Department of Employment, in which you requested access under the *Freedom of Information Act 1982* (Cth) (FOI Act) to the following:

Decision

I am authorised to make decisions under the FOI Act. My decision regarding your request and the reasons for my decision are set out below.

I have decided to grant access to one document and that certain information contained in that document is exempt from release under section 47F of the FOI Act.

Reasons for decision

Section 47F of the FOI Act relevantly provides:

- (1) *A document is conditionally exempt if its disclosure under this Act would involve the unreasonable disclosure of personal information about any person...*

Attachment A**Review by the Australian Information Commissioner**

Section 54L of the FOI Act gives you the right to apply to the Australian Information Commissioner (AIC) to seek a review of this decision.

If you wish to have the decision reviewed by the AIC you must apply for the review, in writing or by using the online merits review form available on the AIC's website at www.oaic.gov.au, within 60 days of receipt of this letter. To assist the AIC your application should include a copy of this decision and your contact details. You should also clearly set out why you are objecting to the decision.

You can also complain to the AIC or Commonwealth Ombudsman about how the Minister handled an FOI request, or other actions the Minister took under the FOI Act.
