Freedom of Information (FOI) request - Access Decision

On 23 November 2017, the Department of Immigration and Border Protection (the Department) received a request for access to documents under the *Freedom of Information Act 1982* (the FOI Act).

On 20 December 2017 the Home Affairs Portfolio, including the Department of Home Affairs, was formally established. The Department of Home Affairs includes the entirety of the Department of Immigration and Border Protection, the Australian Border Force and the Office of Transport Security from within the Department of Infrastructure and Regional Development. It also includes specific functions from the Attorney-General's Department, the Department of Social Services and the Department of the Prime Minister and Cabinet.

As such a decision has now been made on your request by the Department of Home Affairs.

The purpose of this letter is to provide you with a decision on your request for access under the FOI Act.

1 Scope of request

You have requested access to the following documents:

I would like information relating to Global Skills and Business Services (ABN 72 398 283 909), and its director Lubo Jack Raskovic. Can you please provide any briefing notes, issues notes or other reports sent to the Minister's office regarding Global Skills and Business Services and/or its director Lubo Jack Raskovic, in the past 12 months. I also seek a schedule of any documents captured by this request.

2 Authority to make decision

I am an officer authorised under section 23 of the FOI Act to make decisions in respect of requests to access documents or to amend or annotate records.

3 Relevant material

In reaching my decision I referred to the following:

- the terms of your request
- the FOI Act
- Guidelines published by the Office of the Information Commissioner under section 93A of the FOI Act (the FOI Guidelines)
- advice from the relevant business areas of the Department
- the Department's guidance material on the FOI Act

4 Documents in scope of request

The Department has undertaken reasonable searches in relation to the documents you have requested access to.

Searches

In summary, the searches undertaken by the relevant business areas in relation to your request included:

- Searches of departmental systems, including emails and file storage software from relevant business areas

Having regard to your request and the types of documents that may fall within the scope of your request I am satisfied that the searches conducted were extremely thorough and all reasonable steps have been taken to locate any document relevant to your request.

5 Decision

Section 24A of the FOI Act provided that the Department may refuse a request for access to a document if all reasonable steps have been taken to find the document and the Department is satisfied that the document does not exist.

Having considered the searches outlined above, I am satisfied that the Department has undertaken reasonable searches in relation to your request and that no documents were in the possession of the Department on 23 November 2017 when your FOI request was received. As such I am refusing access to the documents requested by you based on the application of section 24A of the FOI Act.

Internal Review

The internal review will be carried out by an officer other than the original decision maker and the Department must make a review decision within 30 days.
