The term 'finally determined' is defined under section 5(9), (9A) and (9B) of the Migration Act 1958. In summary, an application is considered to be finally determined if a primary decision to refuse that application has been made by a departmental officer or the Minister personally and either i) the applicant is not eligible for merits review or ii) the applicant did not initiate merits review within the required timeframe; or iii) the applicant initiated merits review, but the merits review body affirmed (upheld) the primary decision. The person can seek judicial review after a primary refusal decision, or after a merits review body has affirmed the primary refusal decision. Applicants who are yet to apply for judicial review, are in the judicial review process, or have had their application affirmed at judicial review are still finally determined. However, as a matter of departmental eedom policy, individuals who have ongoing judicial review processes are not generally subject to removal from Australia. 60
