# Freedom of Information Act 1982 – Approved arrangements under paragraph 10A(1)(b) and subsection 23(1)

#### **Enabling legislation**

- I, Christopher John Chapman, Principal Officer of the Australian Communications and Media Authority:
  - revoke the arrangements set out in the instrument made by me on 4 February 2011 for the purposes of subsection 23(1) of the *Freedom of Information Act* 1982; and
  - (b) approve the arrangements set out in this instrument for the purposes of paragraph 10A(1)(b) and subsection 23(1) of the Act.

#### Commencement

2. This instrument commences on the date it is made.

#### **Definitions and interpretation**

- 3. In this instrument, unless the contrary intention appears:
  - (a) "ACMA" means the Australian Communications and Media Authority;
  - (b) "Act" means the Freedom of Information Act 1982;
  - (c) "applicant" means a person who has made an application for access to a document of the ACMA under subsection 15(1) of the Act on or after 1 November 2010;
  - (d) "application for internal review" means an application made under Part VI of the Act to the ACMA on or after 1 November 2010 for internal review of a decision<sup>1</sup>;
  - (e) "EL2" means a position in the ACMA with the classification Executive Level 2;
  - (f) "Lawyer" means a position in the ACMA having the title of "Lawyer" or "Legal Officer" with the classification APS Level 5 or APS Level 6, or "Senior Lawyer" or "Senior Legal Officer" with the classification Executive Level 1;
  - (g) "Member" means a Member of the ACMA and includes the Chair, Deputy Chair and any full-time or part-time Member, but does not include an Associate Member;

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>1</sup> Part VI of the Act deals with the internal review of decisions and relevantly does not apply to a decision made personally by a principal officer of an agency (see subsections 54(1) and 54A(1)) or a decision in relation to the provision of access to a document upon a request that is taken to have been made under section 15AC or 51DA (see section 54E).

- (h) "officer of the ACMA" includes a Member or a member of staff of the ACMA;
- (i) "Regulations" means the Freedom of Information (Charges) Regulations 1982;
- (j) "request" means an application made under subsection 15(1) or section 48 of the Act to the ACMA on or after 1 November 2010<sup>2</sup>;
- (k) "SES1" means a position in the ACMA with the classification Senior Executive Band 1;
- (I) "SES2" means a position in the ACMA with the classification Senior Executive Band 2; and
- (m) a reference to an authorisation to perform or exercise a function or power includes an authorisation to refuse to perform or exercise that function or power.

#### Approved arrangements

- 4. Each person for the time being holding, occupying or performing the duties of an office or position specified in Column 2 of the table in Schedule A is authorised to perform or exercise the corresponding functions or powers specified in Column 1 of the table in Schedule A.
- 5. The functions or powers may be performed or exercised while the person is an officer of the ACMA but not while absent on leave, or suspended, from the ACMA.
