REFORMS TO THE AUSTRALIAN HUMAN RIGHTS COMMISSION, INCLUDING THE FREEDOM COMMISSIONER, & BILL OF RIGHTS

Issue: The Attorney-General has publicly indicated his intention to widen the focus of the Australian Human Rights Commission including by introducing at least one new Freedom Commissioner.

On 17 December 2013, the Attorney-General announced that Cabinet had decided to recommend to her Excellency the Governor-General the appointment of Mr Timothy Wilson as Australia's new Human Rights Commissioner.

Key points

- One of my key priorities as Attorney-General is to rebalance the human rights debate in Australia.
- The Government is concerned that the Australian Human Rights Commission has not always balanced the promotion of traditional common law rights and civil and political rights with its anti-discrimination and other advocacy work.
- The appointment of Mr Wilson will help to restore balance to the Australian Human Rights Commission which had become increasingly narrow and selective in its view of human rights.
- I welcome the President of the Commission's continued support for the introduction of a Freedom Commissioner and expanding the public discussion about rights and freedoms.



- The Commission has a range of functions pertaining to human rights, including those rights recognised by the International Covenant on Civil and Political Rights.



Background

During the election campaign, you indicated your intention to balance the focus of the Australian Human Rights Commission on traditional common law rights, including by considering introducing a new Freedom Commissioner. S47C(1), S47E(d)

On 8 November, the Australian reported you as saying that 'at least one "freedom commissioner" will be appointed next year'. Any statutory appointments would require legislation to create the roles. On 15 November the Australian quoted Commissioner President, Professor Gillian Triggs, giving 'wholehearted' support for the appointment of a Freedom Commissioner. Professor Triggs observed that rights contained within the *International Covenant on Civil and Political Rights* are applied in a 'lop-sided' fashion because not all the rights have been adopted in domestic legislation. You are quoted as saying, 'we are not going to be bringing in a bill of rights or anything like that'.

On 28 November Professor Triggs spoke at length on Lateline about these issues. She supported a Freedom Commissioner, but agreed that complaints about freedoms may be not brought forward to the Commission because there is no legislative basis for these complaints. She suggested one answer would be legislation to protect core freedoms but noted there is no political likelihood of such legislation at present.

On 17 December 2013, you announced that Cabinet had decided to recommend to her Excellency the Governor-General the appointment of Mr Timothy Wilson as Australia's new Human Rights Commissioner. S47C(1), S47E(d)

The position of Human Rights Commissioner has not been separately funded or filled since 2000. During that period the work of the Commissioner has been undertaken by other Commissioners in addition to their own role. The role was most recently undertaken by former President the Hon Catherine Branson QC and is currently vacant. S47C(1),
