As I have mentioned in a previous e-mail, (\$ 47C)

. To date we have put up a notice each time we have released documents in response to an FOI request and we have provide links to the released documents so that they can be downloaded. In a small number of cases we have decided that it would be 'unreasonable' to publish the documents at all or that no link would be provided because the documents were heavily redacted.

A number of agencies including the ATO, ComCare, Department of Environment, and the Departments of Employment and Education (whose websites have not yet been updated) publish information about the documents but do not provide links to the documents themselves. Instead the documents are available on request. DEEWR (as it was) has some linked documents – my understanding is that they put them up in fully accessible formats once they receive a request for the documents following publication of notice on the disclosure log.
