A Coalition-dominated parliamentary committee is backing ACTU concerns that unionbusting legislation promoted by the Morrison government will put workers' rights at risk. The human rights committee says Industrial Relations Minister Christian Porter's amendments to the Ensuring Integrity Bill fail to allay "concerns" about impacts on freedom of organisation and unionists' rights to elect officials.
