- **The Sydney Morning Herald page 9** reports that the President of the International Trade Union Confederation, Sharan Burrow, has said that the Government's Ensuring Integrity Bill, which would make it easier for the Government to deregister unions and disqualify officials if they breach industrial relations laws, has sent "shockwaves around the world". Although Ms Burrow said that bill that passed in the House of Representatives last week was an act of "ideological revenge" and would do "far-reaching damage to our democratic structures", Industrial Relations Minister Christopher Porter said that it was simply to ensure officials "conduct themselves according to Australian law".
