## Freedom of Information Act 1982 application re: Senate Estimate Briefs re OSB

In accordance with Section 31, the 30-day limit for processing your request is suspended from the day that you receive this notice and resumes on either the day you pay the charge, or the day on which AMSA makes a decision not to impose a charge (following your contention of the charges).
