Dear Mr Unmeopa

I refer to your email, dated 1 September 2020, in which you made a request to the Department of the Prime Minister and Cabinet (the **Department**) under the *Freedom of Information Act 1982* (the **FOI Act**) in the following terms:

The Humanitarian Overseas Service Medal has been awarded to Australians from General Electric Infrastructure, Water and Process Technologies; and Aspen Medical Pty Ltd.

I respectfully seek the Department's assessments for public review justifying the award of the medal to these commercial contractors.

Authorised decision-maker

I am authorised to make this decision in accordance with arrangements approved by the Department's Secretary under section 23 of the FOI Act.

Decision

I have decided to refuse your request under section 24A(1)(b)(ii) of the FOI Act.

Reasons

Section 24A(1) of the FOI Act provides as follows:

An agency or Minister may refuse a request for access to a document if:

*(a) all reasonable steps have been taken to find the document;
and*

(b) the agency or Minister is satisfied that the document:

- (i) is in the agency's or Minister's possession but cannot be found; or*
- (ii) does not exist.*

The Department is responsible for administering the award of the Humanitarian Overseas Service Medal (the **HOSM**). The Department's administration of the HOSM does not include assessments for public review.

On that basis, I am satisfied that documents meeting the terms of your request do not exist. I have therefore decided to refuse your request under section 24A(1)(b)(ii) of the FOI Act.

Processing and access charges

I have decided not to impose processing charges in respect of your request.
