Information Act 1986 NOTICE OF DECISION UNDER SECTION 24A OF THE FREEDOM OF INFORMATION ACT 1982

I refer to your request of 13 October 2020 to the Department of Health (the department) seeking access under the Freedom of Information Act 1982 (Cth) (the Act) in the following terms:

All, or as many of the following as possible:

- 1. Any internal documer to regarding co-morbidities pertinent to COVID-19
- 2. Any internal documents regarding contributing factors pertinent to COVID-19 deatrys.
- 3. Any internal documents regarding aggregated statistics pertinent to contributing factors AND/OR co-morbidities related to COVID-19 deaths.
- 4. Any internal documents regarding aggregated statistics pertinent to COVID-19 deaths.
- 5 Any internal documents regarding statistical analysis of COVID-19
- 6. Any internal documents regarding the analysis of COVID-19 deaths.

FOI decision

Tam authorised under subsection 23(1) of the Act to make decisions in relation to Freedom of Information requests. I am writing to notify you of my decision in response to your request.

Appropriate steps have been taken to find the documents referred to in your request including consultation with relevant departmental officers and searches of departmental file management systems.

As a consequence, relying on section 24A of the Act, I cannot provide access to the documents you requested.

FOI review rights

Internal review

The internal review application must be made within 30 days of the date of this notice (or such further period as the department allows). To assist in the internal review process, please provide reasons you consider review of my decision is necessary. The internal review will be undertaken by another officer of the department within 30 days of receipt of your application.
