At 9am on 19/9/18, I met with Interpreter [REDACTED] at the entrance of the Royal Hobart Hospital (RHH). I explained the ABCCs role, and the nature of the investigation. I gave [REDACTED] a brief overview of what we need her to do.

I walked [REDACTED] to the John Holland site office and Investigators [REDACTED], [REDACTED], and Team Leader [REDACTED] introduced themselves. We then entered the site office and signed in, then were escorted to the lunchroom on site.

When we entered the lunchroom, we walked to the back of the lunchroom. CFMMEU Organiser [REDACTED] Section 11C(1) began to film us on his mobile phone. Team Leader [REDACTED] told [REDACTED] Section 11C(1) that we do not give him permission to film or take photos of us. [REDACTED] Section 11C(1) continued to film and began to have a conversation with Team Leader [REDACTED] about why we were on site and what we were there to achieve.

Following this, Team Leader [REDACTED] addressed the workers and told them who we are, what we do, and that we would be walking around the room if anyone wanted to speak to us. Investigator [REDACTED] and myself walked around with the interpreter and spoke to the workers

who did not speak english. During this time, Section 11C(1) took several photos and videos of us speaking to workers. On some occasions, Section 11C(1) would direct the workers around us to leave the area, so it looked like we were all grouped around a single worker. Section 11C(1) made several comments throughout, but nothing that was inappropriate.

We spoke to workers until ~ 10:40am. Business cards were handed out should any of them want to talk to us in a more private environment. We then returned to the office. A photo of Investigator [REDACTED] Interpreter [REDACTED] and myself was posted on Twitter by Section 11C(1). In the photo we are talking to a worker, and our eyes are blacked out. The caption states that we were there to "interrogate workers."
