Arrived at the Site at approximately 9:00 am and met with interpreter briefed on the situation and was explained the purpose of the investigation. and I signed in to the visitor's register at the Site. A John Holland and I to Crib Room 4 on the Site. representative then escorted , The Accuracy Interiors workers had gathered in Crib Room 4. Upon entering Crib Room 4, I witnessed that CFMEU organiser Section 11C(1) was present in the room. appeared to start video recording as we entered the room. and advised him that we did not consent to have our photos then approached taken or be video recorded. appeared to ignore this request and continued to video record the conversation with discussed the purpose of our attendance at the Site. we were at the Site to help the workers and to try to assist them to recover any additional money that they may have been entitled to receive. disagreed and discussed the



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ABCC's stance on other matters, such as right of entry. Section 110(1) explained to state that he had the right to be involved in our discussions with workers, if they wished to have a support person. Section 110(1) advised that he did not wish to be involved. The conversation lasted for approximately 10 minutes.

- addressed the English-speaking workers and explained the purpose of our attendance at the Site. In advised that we wished to speak with workers about possible underpayments and that it was voluntary for them to speak with ABCC. In then repeated this message for the non-English speaking workers. Section 110(1) appeared to be video recording discussion with the workers using his mobile phone.
- At the conclusion of address, a significant number of the English-speaking workers
 left the room. and and went to speak with the remaining English-speaking workers
 about the investigation.
 and I went to speak with the non-English speaking workers.
- and I approached workers who were sitting at the tables located around the crib room.
 and I briefed of what we wished for her to convey to the workers. We advised to explain to the workers that we were from the ABCC and that we wished to speak with about what had occurred, in order to identify any underpayments, as we believed that some workers might be entitled to a higher payment than they had received.
- The first workers and I approached advised that they did not wish to speak with us about the investigation.
- Two other workers and I approached thought they were underpaid, as they had received an hourly rate of \$40. I advised to explain to the workers that we are investigating the matter and that they may be entitled to a higher rate of pay if they were misclassified as contractors. The two workers advised that did not wish to speak about the investigation.
- and I continued to approach workers and offered to speak with them. The workers continued to advise that they did not wish to speak about the matter.
- and I then met with a worker who expressed a desire to speak about the matter.
 explained the purpose of the investigation. The worker advised that for a number of weeks he was paid for 48 hours of work, when he had worked 56 hours on those weeks. The worker added that he had obtained documents that proved he had worked 56 hours. I advised to explain to the worker that the documents would assist us with the investigation. The worker





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did not wish to speak about the matter in the crib room and requested to speak at a different location. I provided a business card to the worker in order to arrange a time to meet, as he stated that had to attend a meeting. The worker did not wish to provide his name or contact details.

•	During the conversation with the worker, section 110(1) appeared to be taking photos of
	and I using his mobile phone. approached approached and had a conversation with him. I
	could not hear what and section 110(1) were saying, as I was speaking to the worker.
