NOTICE OF DECISION UNDER SECTION 24A OF THE FREEDOM OF INFORMATION ACT 1982

I refer to your request of 28 September 2020 to the Department of Health (the department) seeking access under the *Freedom of Information Act 1982* (Cth) (the Act) in the following terms:

The total number of 'service registrars', also known as 'unaccredited registrars' working in Australian hospitals across the country.

The average number of years worked by a service registrar, before eventual admission to a specialty training course; for each specialty.

Information on the typical working hours/salary received by a service registrar while working in a public hospital.

FOI decision

I am authorised under subsection 23(1) of the Act to make decisions in relation to Freedom of Information requests. I am writing to notify you of my decision on your request.

Appropriate steps have been taken to find the documents referred to in your request including consultation with relevant departmental officers and searches of departmental file management systems.

I am satisfied, on the basis of the consultation undertaken and searches conducted, that the department does not hold any of the documents referred to in your request.

As a consequence, relying on subparagraph 24A(1)(b)(ii) of the Act, I cannot provide access to the documents you requested.

FOI review rights

If you are dissatisfied with my decision, you may apply for a review.

Internal review

Under section 54 of the Act, you may apply in writing to the department for an internal review of my decision. The internal review application must be made within 30 days of the date of this notice (or such further period as the department allows). To assist in the internal review process, please provide reasons you consider review of my decision is necessary. The internal review will be carried out by another officer of this department within 30 days of receipt of your application.
