Decision

- The Department of Veterans' Affairs (department) has undertaken a reasonable search of its records and I have made a decision to grant full access to one (1) document within the scope of your request. Authority to make decision

3. I am authorised by the Secretary of the department to make decisions about access to documents in the possession of the department in accordance with section 23(1) of the FOI Act.

4. On Thursday 28 October you made a request for access to documents in the possession of the department. Your request sought access to:

- : Number of work elements with HIE, and
- : HIE correctness rate.
- 5. As no extensions of time have been applied to process your request, a decision on your request is due by 29 November 2021.
- 6. I have decided not to impose a charge in relation to this request, in accordance with Regulation 8 of the *Freedom of Information (Charges) Regulations 2019.*

Material taken into account

- 7. In reaching my decision, I have taken into account:
 - the terms of your request
 - the documents that fall within the scope of your request
 - the content of the documents that fall within the scope of your request
 - consultations with departmental officers about the nature of the documents and the operating environment and functions of the department
 - the guidelines issued by the Australian Information Commissioner under section
 93A of the FOI Act (FOI Guidelines)
 - the Freedom of Information (Charges) Regulations 2019
 - the FOI Act.

Your rights of review
