Re Your FOI Request No. LS5200 re documents re the application for registration of the Liberal Democratic Party

I refer to your request ('FOI Request') for access to documents relating to the application for registration of the Liberal Democratic Party under the <u>Freedom of Information Act 1982</u> (the 'FOI Act'). I apologise for not meeting the extended processing deadline to which you agreed. The delay was an outcome of applying quality control processes to listing the documents.

SUMMARY

- I, Paul Pirani, Chief Legal Officer of the Australian Electoral Commission, am an officer authorised under section 23(1) of the FOI Act to make decisions in relation to FOI requests.
- You requested (your 'FOI Request') access to documents that are held in relation to the application for registration of the Liberal Democratic Party (the 'LDP' under Part XI of the <u>Commonwealth Electoral Act 1918</u> (Cth) ("Electoral Act"), specifically:
 - Documents held that relate to the consideration or determination by the AEC of matters arising under s129(1)(c)-(da) of the Electoral Act, and
 - Documents held by the AEC pursuant to the operation of s132(2)(b)(iv) of the Electoral Act, that is, any submission received by the AEC believing that the application for registration should be refused under s129(1)(c)-(da) ("Submissions"), and any replies received to the Submissions for the purposes of s132(5)(b) of the Electoral Act ("Replies"), and
 - 3. Documents held by the AEC in relation to any considerations of the Submissions and Replies pursuant to s132(7)(d) of the Electoral Act.

- I identified 94 documents that relate to your request which I list in Annexure 1 to my letter. I did this by directing inquiries to the AEC's Funding and Disclosure Branch that has the carriage of processing applications for registration of political parties under section 133 of the Electoral Act.
- 5 Of the 94 retrieved documents I decided to:
 - (a) give access to 11 documents;
 - (b) refuse access to 41 documents and offer in lieu access to edited copies of those documents;
 - (c) refuse access to 26 documents; and
 - (d) subsume a decision about access to 16 documents in the substantive decision made in relation to other retrieved documents of which they were copies.
- Annexure 1 lists each of the retrieved documents with a brief description of each document and the reason for my decision about that document.
- The processing of this request was extended to permit parties affected by the FOI Request to be consulted and you agreed to a further extension to 23 January 2015 to take account of the interruption to processing over the Christmas-New Year period.

DECISION AND REASONS FOR DECISION

Decision

- 8 With regard to the documents identified in Annexure 1, I have decided:
 - (a) to grant access in full to Document Nos. 4, 8, 9, 12, 25, 26, 27, 34, 42, 82 and 93:
 - (b) to refuse access Document Nos. 5, 6, 7, 13, 14, 15, 16, 17, 18, 19, 20, 21, 22, 23, 28, 29, 30, 31, 32, 35, 45, 46, 47, 48, 50, 52, 53, 54, 56, 60, 61, 62, 63, 66, 78, 81, 84, 85, 86, 87 and 91 and to offer in lieu to grant access in part to those documents edited in accordance with section 22 of the FOI Act to delete:
 - (i) irrelevant material from Document No. 32;
 - (ii) exempt material in accordance with section 42 (Documents subject to legal professional privilege) of the FOI Act from Document No. 45,
 - (iii) conditionally exempt material in accordance with section 47C (Public interest conditional exemptions—deliberative processes) from Document Nos. 45 and 60.
 - (iv) conditionally exempt material in accordance with section 47F (Public interest conditional exemptions—personal privacy) from Document Nos. 5, 6, 7, 13, 14, 15, 16, 17, 18, 19, 20, 21, 22, 23, 28, 29, 30, 31, 35, 45, 46, 47, 48, 50, 52, 53, 54, 56, 60, 61, 62, 63, 66, 78, 81, 84, 85,

- 86, 87 and, 91 as providing access to the conditionally exempt material would be contrary to the public interest;
- (v) conditionally exempt material in accordance with section 47G (Public interest conditional exemptions—business) from Document No. 81 as providing access would be contrary to the public interest;
- (c) refuse access to Document Nos. 1, 2, 3, 10, 11, 32, 33, 36, 37, 38, 39, 40, 41, 43, 44, 49, 51, 55, 64, 76, 77, 79, 83, 88, 89, 90 and 94 because in the case of:
 - (i) Document Nos. 10, 44, 76, 79 and 83, they are outside the scope of documents that may be requested in an FOI Request by reason of the carve out in paragraph (d) of the definition of document in subsection 4(1) of the FOI Act;
 - (ii) the entirety of Document Nos. 1, 3, 36, 37, 38, 39, 40, 41, 55, 64, 77, 88, 89, 90 and 94 are irrelevant to the FOI Request;
 - (iii) Document Nos. 11, 33, 43, 49 and 51, which contain exempt material for the purposes of section 42 (Documents subject to legal professional privilege) of the FOI Act and it was not practicable to produce a meaningful version of the document by editing it in accordance with section 22 of the FOI Act;
 - (iv) Document Nos. 2 which contains conditionally exempt material for the purposes of section 47F of the FOI Act and it was not practicable to produce a meaningful version of the document by editing it in accordance with section 22 of the FOI Act;
- (d) to subsume my decision on access to Document Nos. 24, 57, 58, 59, 65, 67, 68, 69, 70, 71, 72, 73, 74, 75, 77, 80 and 92 in my decision on access to the substantive document to which it relates as indicated in relation to it in column 4 of Annexure 1.
- I also edited the description of certain documents listed in Annexure 1 to remove conditionally exempt personal information that was unreasonable to publish.

Material taken into account

- 10 I have taken the following material into account in making my decision:
 - (a) the content of the documents that fall within the scope of your request;
 - (b) the FOI Act (specifically sections 3, 3A, 4, 11, 11A, 11B, 15AA, 15AB, 22, 42, 47C, 47F and 47G)
 - the guidelines (the 'Guidelines)issued by the Australian Information Commissioner under section 93A of the FOI Act (specifically 3.85 – 3.90, 6.56 to 6.77, 6.113 – 6.156 and 6.157 – 6.187)

Reasons

Background

- The LDP was originally registered as the Liberty and Democracy Party on 7 September 2007. The AEC decision on the application to register the LDP is published on the AEC website at http://www.aec.gov.au/Parties and Representatives/party registration/Registration Decisions/2007/ldp.htm.
- The LDP has been continuously registered as a political party on the Register of Political Parties kept by the AEC under section 125 of the Electoral Act since 7 September 2007.

Documents subject to legal professional privilege

- Document Nos. 11, 33, 44, 45, 49 and 51 contain material that is subject to legal professional privilege belonging to the AEC being substantive communications between the AEC and its in house lawyer by way of requesting and providing legal advice in relation to the application to register the LDP.
- 14 Each request for advice was made in the following circumstances:
 - (a) The lawyer was an admitted legal practitioner.
 - (b) The terms of the lawyer's employment included giving legal advice as from time to time required by the AEC in relation to the performance of its functions, in this case the consideration of the application to register the LDP on the Register of Political Parties.
 - (c) The terms of the lawyer's employment being such that it is not lawful to give the lawyer a direction as to the conclusion that should be reached in relation to the matter under advice.
 - (d) The lawyer advising was giving independent professional legal advice. The lawyer was an admitted legal practitioner.
 - (e) A solicitor-client relationship existed between the lawyer and the AEC in relation to the giving of that advice.
- The terms of the advice were and remain confidential and the AEC has not waived its legal professional privilege in respect of the requests for advice and the advice given by the lawyer.
- However, although Document No. 34 is correspondence between a solicitor and client, legal professional privilege does not accrue because it is formal correspondence that does not contain a privileged communication: see Commonwealth of Australia v Dutton [2000] FCA 1466 per Moore J at paragraph 43.

Documents containing deliberative matter

- Document Nos. 45, 60 and 77 contain conditionally exempt material for the purposes of section 47C (Public interest conditional exemptions—deliberative processes) of the FOI Act.
- Among the AEC's functions is the consideration of applications for the registration of an eligible political party made under section 126 of the Electoral Act.
- Document Nos. 45, 60 and 77 record the deliberations by the AEC of an application made under section 126 of the Electoral Act by the LDP.
- Section 47C of the FOI Act applies to conditionally exempt the deliberations other than:
 - (i) operational information; and
 - (ii) purely factual material.
- 21 Paragraphs 6.56 to 6.77of the Guidelines give guidance about how a decision maker should decide whether material is exempt under section 47C of the FOI Act.
- 22 In particular, paragraph 6.62 of the Guidelines states:

6.62 A deliberative process involves the exercise of judgement in developing and making a selection from different options:

The action of deliberating, in common understanding, involves the weighing up or evaluation of the competing arguments or considerations that may have a bearing upon one's course of action. In short, the deliberative processes involved in the functions of an agency are its thinking processes – the processes of reflection, for example, upon the wisdom and expediency of a proposal, a particular decision or a course of action.²⁴

- It was open to me to find that Document Nos. 45, 60 and 77 contain deliberative material relating to the consideration of the LDP application under section 126 of the Electoral Act.
- I detail in column 4 of Annexure 1 my finding in respect of each of Document Nos. 45, 60 and 77.

Documents containing Personal Information

- Section 47F of the FOI Act applies to a document to the extent that disclosure under the FOI Act would involve the unreasonable disclosure of personal information about that individual.
- I have not addressed the application of section 47F of the FOI Act to documents to which I have refused access on other grounds.

Document Nos. 2, 5, 6, 7, 9, 12, 13, 14, 15, 16, 17, 18, 19, 20, 21, 22, 23, 28, 29, 30, 31, 32, 34, 35, 42, 45, 46, 47, 48, 50, 52, 53, 54, 56, 57, 58, 59, 60, 61, 62, 63, 65, 66, 67, 68, 71, 75, 77, 78, 81, 82, 84, 85, 86, 87, 91 and 92 contain personal information of various types as discussed below.

(a) Publication of names of LDP members and officials

- Publication of the names of individual members of the LDP (other than its secretary or party agent) would publicly link that person to the political party thereby gratuitously providing further personal information about that person. The risk of such a member encountering hostility by reason of the link to the party makes it unreasonable to publish their names and other detail.
- The secretary, registered officer and the party agent are the public interface of the LDP and it is reasonable to give the names of these officials of the LDP in connection with the LDP.

(b) Publication of LDP addresses

- Publication of the addresses of individual members of the LDP (other than its secretary or party agent) would publicly link that person to the political party thereby gratuitously providing further personal information about that person. The risk of such a member encountering hostility by reason of the link to the party makes it unreasonable to publish their names and other detail.
- The secretary and the party agent are the public interface of the LDP and it is not unreasonable to give the official addresses of these officials of the LDP.
- However, it is unreasonable to disclose the private address of Senator Leyonhjelm because Mr Leyonhjelm has been accepted for enrolment under section 104 of the Electoral Act with the outcome that his private address is not shown on the electoral Roll (i.e. he is a silent elector).

(c) Publication of LDP telephone numbers

- The reasoning at paragraphs 30 32 above apply also to the reasonableness of publishing telephone numbers of members, employees and officials of the LDP (other than the Secretary-Treasurer, Registered Officer and Party Agent).
- It is also unreasonable to publish private telephone numbers of Senator Leyonhjelm as he is a silent elector.
- 35 Senator Leyonhjelm has an office at which he may be contacted in his public capacity as a Senator.

(d) Publication of details of officials

- A number of the documents contain personal information about AEC officials, other Commonwealth officials or State or Territory officials ('Public Officials') being the official's:
 - (a) name;
 - (b) telephone number;

- (c) fax number;
- (d) official postal address; and
- (e) email address;
- The guidelines issued by the Australian Information Commissioner under section 93A of the FOI Act (the 'Guidelines') at paragraph 6.140 say:

Where public servants' personal information is included in a document because of their usual duties or responsibilities, it would not be unreasonable to disclose unless special circumstances existed.

I do not see any special circumstance existing that would require withholding of the names and contact details of AEC officials.

(e) Facsimiles of signatures

Consideration of the risk of identity theft being facilitated by publishing a facsimile of an individual's signature or manuscript initialling of a document militates against finding that it is reasonable to publish a facsimile of the individual's signature or manuscript initialling of a document.

Business information

- Section 47G of the FOI Act applies to Document No. 81 with the consequence that a decision maker must decide whether it is reasonable to give access to the particular item of business information.
- I believe that giving access to the business account details puts at risk misuse of those details to authorise the publishing of spurious *Gazette* notices. It follows that it is unreasonable to disclose this business information.
- Also, for this reason giving access to the business information would be contrary to the public interest.

Documents outside the scope of FOI Requests

- I found that Document Nos. 10, 44, 76, 79 and 83 are outside the scope of documents that may be requested in an FOI Request by reason of the carve out in paragraph (d) of the definition of document in subsection 4(1) of the FOI Act.
- Document No. 10 has been published for reference on the websites of the several State and Territory Electoral Commissions.
- Document Nos. 44 and 76 are extracts of the Electoral Act which Act is published for reference on the Comlaw website at http://www.comlaw.gov.au/Series/C1918A00027.
- Document No. 79 is the reasons for decision made on the application to register the LDP which are published for reference on the AEC website at http://www.aec.gov.au/Parties and Representatives/party registration/Registration n Decisions/2007/ldp.htm.

- Document No. 83 is a copy of Special Gazette S176 published on 11 September 2007 and republished for reference on the Comlaw website at http://www.comlaw.gov.au/file/2007GN37.
- In so far as is material, subsection 4(1) of the FOI provides:

4 Interpretation

(1) In this Act, unless the contrary intention appears:

but does not include:

- (d) material maintained for reference purposes that is otherwise publicly available; or
- It follows that Document Nos. 10, 44, 76, 79 and 83 are out of scope of the class of document that may be requested under Part III of the FOI Act as a consequence of the operation of the carve out from the definition of 'document' provided by paragraph (d) of subsection 4(1) of the FOI

Redaction of exempt material

- It is appropriate to treat a conditionally exempt document to which access in full is refused as an exempt document for the purposes of section 22 of the FOI Act.
- As a decision maker, I am required to consider the application to a document of section 22 of the FOI Act which provides for access being given to edited copies of documents with exempt or irrelevant matter deleted.
- It is open to me to consider whether, for the purposes of paragraph 22(1)(b) of the FOI, it is possible for the AEC to prepare a copy (an edited copy) of the document, modified by deletions, ensuring that the edited copy would not disclose any information that would reasonably be regarded as irrelevant to the FOI Request or be exempt information. My consideration of this issue is indicated in the fourth column of Annexure 1.
- It is also open to consider whether, for the purposes of paragraph 22(1)(c) of the FOI Act, having regard to the resources available to modify the relevant document, it is reasonably practicable for the AEC to prepare the edited copy of that document. My consideration of this issue is indicated in the fourth column of Annexure 1.

OFFER OF EDITED DOCUMENTS

- In accordance with paragraph 8 of this letter, I offer to provide you with an edited version of documents listed in paragraph 8 of this letter with the deletions described in that paragraph. This offer remains open for acceptance for 30 days from the date of this letter.
- If the offer is not accepted within the 30 day period, then the decision in paragraph 8 of this letter to refuse access the documents listed in paragraph 8 will stand.

YOUR REVIEW RIGHTS

If you are dissatisfied with my decision, you may apply for internal review or Information Commissioner review of the decision. We encourage you to seek internal review as a first step as it may provide a more rapid resolution of your concerns.

Internal review

- Under section 54 of the FOI Act, you may apply in writing to the AEC for an internal review of my decision. The internal review application must be made within 30 days of the date of this letter.
- Where possible please attach reasons why you believe review of the decision is necessary. The internal review will be carried out by another officer within 30 days.

Information Commissioner review

Under section 54L of the FOI Act, you may apply to the Australian Information Commissioner to review my decision. An application for review by the Information Commissioner must be made in writing within 60 days of the date of this letter, and be lodged in one of the following ways:
