Freedom of Information Request 202200023

On 24 April 2022 the Australian National University received your request seeking access to documents under the *Freedom of Information Act 1982* (the Act).

1. Scope of Request

I have taken your request to be as follows:

'kindly provide the following data for the 2021/22 admission cycle (i.e. 2021 fall intake):

1. List of all postgraduate taught programmes 2. Numbers of all applications (for each specific programme) 3. Numbers of all offers made (for each specific programme) 4. Numbers of Chinese nationality applications (for each specific programme) 5. Numbers of Chinese nationality offers made (for each specific programme)'

The purpose of this letter is to provide you with a decision on your request for access under the Act.

2. Authority to Make Decision

I am an officer authorised under section 23 of the Act to make decisions in respect of requests to access documents or to amend or annotate records.

3. Relevant Material

In reaching my decision I referred to the following:

- The terms of your request
