Responding to your questions

I refer to our previous correspondence and your latest questions to the Australian Curriculum, Assessment and Reporting Authority (**ACARA**) posted on the Right to Know website on 14 May 2015 at

(https://www.righttoknow.org.au/request/copyright in my school website c#comment-973).

1. Your questions

I note that your two (2) questions are as follows:

"First, does ACARA claim that it holds copyright in all or any of the data presented on the My School website? Second, does ACARA have any objection, on the basis of a claim of copyright, to the public reproduction of any or all of the school-related information on the My School website?"

2. My response

ACARA objects to the reproduction of school-related information from the *My School* website by third parties in ways which the Education Council (or its predecessors) have directed ACARA to take reasonable measures to address – in particular the publication of simplistic league tables. In my letter to you dated 26 February 2015, published on the Right to Know website at the above weblink, I advised (at heading 6) that:

- ACARA relies on more than one area of law (including the Copyright Act 1968 (Cth)) to carry out this directive; and
- b. As part of these bundle of rights, ACARA relies on the *My School* Terms of Use, at (http://www.myschool.edu.au/ContactUs/TermsOfUse).
