NOTICE OF DECISION

I refer to your request to the Department of Health (Department) of 20 February 2015 seeking access under the *Freedom of Information Act 1982* (FOI Act) to:

“any documents relating to the 2002 Canterbury Bankstown Bulldogs salary cap scandal”

I am writing to advise you of my decision.

Decision

The Department has been unable to find any documents containing the information you have requested above.

I must therefore refuse access pursuant to section 24A of the FOI Act on the basis that the documents sought do not exist.

A thorough and extensive search and consultation with the relevant policy and program areas has revealed that there are no documents held by the Department that relate to the 2002 Canterbury Bankstown Bulldogs salary cap scandal.

I am satisfied that all reasonable steps have been taken and no such documents exist.

Review rights

If you are dissatisfied with my decision, you may apply for an internal review or Australian Information Commissioner (Information Commissioner) review of the decision.

Internal review

Under section 54 of the FOI Act, you may apply in writing to the Department for an internal review of my decision. The internal review application must be made within 30 days of the

date of this notice (or such further period as the Department allows). Where possible please provide reasons why you consider review of the decision is necessary.
